
### **Sermon Flow**

- 3. What does the text signify to us?
  - a. Conform to God's standard live a holy life
  - b. Remember God's election of you

## **Summary of the Hypotheses Concerning the Dietary Regulations**

- 1. Arbitrary
  - a. There is no purpose behind the regulations, or their purpose is known only to God
- 2. Cultic
  - a. These animals were chosen as inedible because of their use in pagan worship and/or their association with pagan deities
- 3. Hygienic
  - a. The unclean animals are unclean because they often carry disease and would thereby get the Israelites sick
- 4. Symbolic
  - a. The clean animals represent how Israel is supposed to act and behave in contrast to the other nations, which are represented by the unclean animals
